Introduction:

This guide is meant to help us keep unity in our prayer focus and help guide us in taking a daily time of worship, meditation of the Word and prayer, during the next 21 days. We pray and desire that this time of corporate fasting and prayer will bring us into a closer and more intimate relationship with God and help us grow in our spiritual relationship to one and another. We ask God that during this fast He will breathe new life upon all the different areas of our lives as we seek Him. And that our spirits will be inspired and be set ablaze by the fire of the Holy Spirit to provoke impact in our church, our families, our community and our region.

As we begin tomorrow these 21 days, remember this is NOT a diet, if you control what you eat but you don't take daily time to pray and seek God, you are then just having a nutritional diet and not a spiritual fast. Fasting is important because it makes us more sensitive to the Holy Spirit. When we fast, we are denying ourselves the pleasure of eating or doing something we find pleasurable to declare we submit and surrender to God. It is an act of humility and worship, in recognition that we are asking God to cleanse our bodies and take away anything that hinders our connection with Him. Some Christian leaders through Church history have call the union of fasting and praying an Atomical Spiritual Bomb, for the power it has, to align ourselves with God's purposes.

We live busy life schedules that make it sometimes complicated to set aside some quiet time between us and God. The following are suggestions to help you set aside prayer time for this moment but also something that could be applied to everyday to cultivate a stronger prayer life.

- Be Intentional We live in a hustling and buzzling time that requires a lot of our time and attention, just like we
 do when we are starting to cultivate a relationship, we need to intentionally set aside time for prayer. If we don't
 take the time to make it happen, it is unlike it will happen spontaneously.
- 2. Set Alarms Sounds basic, but sometimes we fail in the little things. Make sure to review your schedule and evaluate your daily engagements and needs and set alarms to remind yourself of the times you have compromise to pray.
- Anytime is better than no time Depending on how complex your schedule is or not consider setting aside 10, 15, 30 or 60 minutes in the day. Consider they don't have to be all together; it can be at different moments in the day. For example, take a few minutes when you wake up and you are showering, pray while you are in your car on the way to or from work, do it during your quick break or your lunchtime or before you go to bed.
- 4. Tradeoff to Upgrade Not all the things we do in the day are necessities, if you spend time in the day scrolling social media or watching tv or browsing online, take some of that time instead to pray and read the Word.
- 5. Support each other we are all in this time of fast and prayer together, if you have the opportunity call or video or meet with others for a quick moment of prayer together. Even if you cannot meet, consider praying for others.

Devotional:

Hunger is the body's physiological innate reaction to remind us to provide it for the nutrients it needs to function. Sever hunger causes a person to have abdominal discomfort, Cravings, growling in their stomach, Grumpiness, Headache, Light-headiness and makes them think about food constantly. As believers we are called to be hungry and thirsty for the presence of God. God's presence manifested in our lives has the power of satisfying all our needs in a way no natural substance can do it. As we fast, we surrender our physical body desires to recognize that we need more of God. Does your life reflect that you have hunger for God?

Today's Prayer:

Devotional:

And that is expected to increase exponentially with the availability of access to internet and telecommunications. Now more than ever before, we have more access to information. You can literally in a matter of seconds look up any topic. However, the accessibility to information and the increase of knowledge does not necessarily mean we are wiser or necessarily more effective. Often, we repeat a lot of similar mistakes that have affected and impacted previous generations that didn't have all the information we got. Having knowledge is possessing a collection of facts and information, while having wisdom is having the ability to apply and make decisions with the information, we the knowledge we got. As believers in modern times, we have access to all sorts of Bibles, study resources, audio, video and communications systems that believers in the past couldn't even dream. Yet somehow it begs to question what difference are we doing with all the resources we got our disposal. Are we being more effective? Are we causing a bigger impact? Or do we keep looking at stories of the past and wondering and hoping we could see or experience the stories we read?

Devotional:

Did you know the average human hair strand has a width between 0.17 to 0.18mm while the average sink pipe has width of 38mm. Yet hair is on the most common causes of clogging pipes. As tiny and fragile as the hair strands are they manage to adhere to the walls of the pipe in a way that it starts accumulating all the dirt that flushes down. And end up causing severe clogs that can affect the flow of the water or all together block the water from flowing at all. Plumbers recommend people should do a proper cleansing and flushing of the drains at least once a week and do a professional cleaning once a year. If you ever taken it upon yourself or seem someone pull out a hair clog from a pipe, you can recall is hard to pull out, is slimy, yucky, dirty and often times it smells rotten. Similar to this there are areas in our lives, thoughts, feelings, sins, interactions with the occult, pain from past or present hurts that we ignore because we fool ourselves to believe oh that is just miniscule it does not matter, I will just ignore. But those tiny things are blocking what God wants to work and do in our lives. So instead of having a full free flow of the Holy Spirit, we only getting drippings of what we can experience; When God is willing and expectant to give us so much more, but we are not realizing we just need to surrender it all. As we continue in these days of fast and prayer, make inventory of what might be the hidden parts of your life you have not fully surrender to God.

Today's Prayer:

Lord, we want to completely surrender to You. Please do a serious plumbing job in your life and unclog all the junk out of our lives. Take away all those little or big things that are hindering the flow and manifestation of Your Holy Spirit in us. Devotional: Theres a testimony of a young Christian family that was going through a difficult time, they had a little 4yo girl and a baby boy that was barely few months old. The woman had stopped working as she help to be a caregiver for her mom. The father of the family had lost his job and God told him to prepare as he was soon going to go do missionary work in another country. While he was looking for jobs and praying God about the words he had received. He would go out on his bike every day with a wooden box full of basic tools, offering to do house repairs to make some money although sometimes it might take a few days to get paid. The resources they had were limited and they had run out of groceries. In the afternoon they gather in the middle of the tiny living room and the mom made a list of the basic groceries they needed to get through the week. Together they kneel having their kids with them and pray to God, declaring Father you have promised to take care of our needs as we seek you, we need the items on this list. A few hours later someone called at their door, it was a friend from church with bags of groceries. She said: "I was doing my groceries and God stir in my heart that I had to get these for you." When they opened the bags, every single one of the items on the list they had prayed for were there, not more, not less, but exactly what they needed. Throughout the next several months other miracles kept happening and God made provision and way for the whole family to go missionary work another country. The dad minister and help men suffering with alcoholism, the mom minister to women suffering domestic violence, all the meanwhile they lived in a small poor community where they help to restore local churches. One day their little girl got extremely sick with stomach flu and severe fever that was getting worse by the day. They were very concerned as the community where they lived was hours away from the town where they could have access to a doctor. After they prayed and put the kids to bed, the parents were talking among themselves and agreed the next day they would need to take the bus to the city to see a doctor. The little girl heard them and sat in the bed and said why are you worried, we just prayed, and God is going to heal me. The next day when they woke up all the symptoms including the fever were completely gone. You see in the middle of the challenges and circumstances this family faced they never ignored or denied their reality, nor did they try to hide it from their kids. Instead, they chose to trust God above what they were seeing and pray to Him, in the process teaching their kids an important lesson about trusting God. As we go into our time of reflection and prayer today, consider taking a piece of paper and write to God what are the things you are most concern about and cast your worries upon Him, trusting that He cares for you.

Today's Prayer: Lord, please forgive us when we put our focus on the issues before us and we neglect to recognize that nothing, absolutely nothing is impossible for you. Forgive us when we try to do things in our own might and strength and understanding. Please help guide our paths in a way that your Holy Spirit will keep us focus on the fact that You are mighty, and You have care for every aspect and need of our lives. We submit our problems, our challenges, our angers, our dreams, our desires and our hopes to You. Guide our lives God and let our lives be a testimony that we trust you!

Devotional:

There is an anecdote that talks about a small rural farmer town in the 1950s that was going through a severe drought. The people of the town were desperate because this was impacting on their livelihood. The situation was so dire they decided to go to the local small church and ask the priest to pray for a miracle and plead God to send them rain since he was constantly telling them that nothing was impossible for God. The priest agreed to pray with them under one condition, they had to pray with faith believing it will be done. So daily all the town people would go to the church and pray asking God to send rain. After a few days nothing had changed and they went to confront the priest, questioning why nothing had happened. He responded saying, if you had faith that God could sent the rain, why none of you have ever came to church carrying in an umbrella. Similar to this story there is an actual testimony from the Azuza Revival, a man that had wooden leg when to Seymour and asked him to pray for his leg as it was starting to get gangrene. The preacher upset looked at the man and said "You have the wooden leg on. It would be a challenge for God to grow a leg out when the wooden leg is attached." After removing the artificial limb, the man stood before Seymour balancing on his good leg. Seymour laid hands on the gentleman and prayed, "Let Thy name be glorified. In the name of Jesus, I command this leg to grow out. The gangrene is gone; you are healed." To everyone's amazement, they saw movement in the empty pant leg; suddenly, the leg grew out. The crowd went wild with rejoicing and praise as the man ran around the room. Brother Seymour could not even preach that night; everyone was shouting and dancing until two in the morning. About 1,000 people were saved because of this one miracle. We say with our words that we believe God can do anything, but are we really truly believing for what we praying for?

Today's Prayer:

Lord, thank you for this great promise of hope, this fundamental truth of our salvation and our life. O God, strengthen both my faith and my faithfulness, my dependence and my trustworthiness. Let me truly find fullness of life through persistence in faith. In Jesus name, Amen!

Devotional: Did you know that in just the past 25 years in the USA, they have produced over 300 movies about superheroes. According to Statista in just the year 2019 it is estimated that the revenue of the movie tickets from action heroes' movies was 3.19 billion US Dollars. We love seeing our heroes unlimited and having supernatural capacities that allow them to undo evil and do good. Psychologists believe that our fascination for this comes from an intrinsic need of feeling someone will be able to come to our rescue. And it makes sense when we look at the mess around us, who wouldn't like to have a Superman to catch bad guys, or a Dr Xavier that can help read people's minds or an Arrow to deal with corruption. But what if I tell you that you have access to a real superpower called intercession. You see when we pray, we are communicating with God, but when we intercede, we are taking a stand before God and heaven to do something in favor of a person, a region, a situation. Like for example have you consider that through intercession you can literally take a stand between life or death. And this is no exaggeration, there are several testimonies in the Bible and in modern life. There is a testimony of a teenage girl that woke up in the middle of the night and began to intercede for God to protect the life of a guy from church, she did not know why, but she spent an hour crying for his life. Next day she heard the night before that a guy was walking home from the park and a group of drug dealers mistook him for someone else. They were beating him up as he kept begging them to stop but they were not listening and they put two guns on his head. When this happened and tall glowing man figured showed before them and said let him go now. They released the guy and took off running screaming don't hurt us. When he got up, looked around and couldn't see anyone nearby. Like this there are many testimonies of how intercession had made a difference between life and death and even made impact in big historical moments. During the Second World War there was a group of intercessors that would gather in England praying for God to give favor to the allied forces and to confuse the enemies' decisions. Years later when looking at the historical records of these meetings they coincide with the dates when big decisions were made that impacted on the outcome of the war. What big impact you wish to see around you? What makes your blood boil? Have you considered interceding over these matters? You want to talk to someone and you text message and expect a reply in seconds. You want to heat your food and boom, throw the plate in the microwave and press +30 (let's be honest we don't even bother to enter the cook time). However, prayer and intercession is not a magic stick, a WhatsApp message or a microwave. Sometimes part of our spiritual growth is learning that we need to be consistent and persistent until we see results, or we hear from God to do differently. While teaching Jesus himself gave two parables about the importance of persistence in Luke 11:5-9 and Luke 18:1-8. In both of these stories the man and the woman obtain what they were asking for because of their persistence. In some Bible translations it says that they were answered because of their importunity, their boldness, their audacity, their shameless persistence. In the things you are waiting on from God, are you been shamelessly persistent in your prayer and intercession? Remember to PUSH – Pray Until Something Happens.

Sister Lankford, wife of Brother Lankford, remembered one event that happened about a year after the man's leg grew out. A man came in with one arm missing; it had been severed ten years earlier in 1897, in a work-related accident. You could see down into the hole where it was rotting and turning black; bone was visible. Seymour asked the man, "Can you work with just one arm?" The man replied that he was given minimal paying jobs and could barely make enough money to even eat. Seymour shook his head and asked the man if he was married and had children, to which the man replied yes to both questions. "This man needs to be able to make a living. This man needs to work, and he needs to be able to pay his tithe. Will you tithe if I pray for you and God gives you your arm back?" Seymour asked teasingly. The man said ves. Seymour burst out laughing. "I'm just having fun." He then laid his hands on the man's shoulder and commanded the missing arm to grow out. Witnesses could see the bone growing and the flesh turning pink. Within a few seconds, the arm grew out, even down to the fingernails. Completely. The healed man stood in utter amazement. A few weeks later, the healed gentleman came back and explained how his former job was restored to him. He brought 200 coworkers with him: not all at once, but at different times. All were saved and healed when the saints' laid hands upon them." What we just read is a recorded testimony from the Azusa Street revival, in which God's power was manifested in a supernatural way. When we read testimonies like this and the testimonies of the miracles of Jesus, our minds are blown. These are things that go beyond our human comprehension of natural physics and explanations, but that is just the thing. God supersedes all we know and all we imagine. Jesus walked on water, healed all sorts of sickness, raised the dead, turn water into wine, multiply fish and bread and He said that we will do the works he did and even greater things. I mean can you imagine for a second how your brain, would process if you saw or experience in front of a miracle like the ones Jesus did or the one in this testimony.

When we talk about church, we often make the mistake of thinking about just a building or a body of Christian people that gather together. But when you look at the origin of the initial greek word Ekklesia, before it got translated. Ekklesia was made out of two greek words that mean the call out ones and it referred to a public assembly of people were they deliberated and made decisions that would impact that region. When Jesus called us to be Ekklesia or as translated in English church, He did not just mean to say we just meet together to sing, teach and pray. But it actually meant that we are ambassadors of His Kingdom, called to be causing and impact in the regions were we are. As we look upon this today, I will challenge you to take a minute to look at what the news headlines of your city and your country say. What do your headlines say? Do they reflect the impact of the local church? What do you want them to say?

In March 1858, evangelist Charles G. Finney was preaching in Boston and a prayer meeting was also being held. Most towns in Massachusetts were touched by the revival, with more than 5,000 conversions before March was out. A newspaper correspondent at the time wrote that revival issues were the most important situation in the cities. Most newspapers at the time considered revival events to be their front-page news. Here are some examples of the headlines:

Devotional:

The hottest part of a fire is where you see blue in the flames, in these areas the temperature can range 2,500 to 2,900 degrees Fahrenheit. This blue color indicates complete combustion, meaning there has been a perfect mixing of fuel and oxygen. To create a fire, you need three basic things Heat, Oxygen and Fuel. And as we just read the hottest burning happens when there is a perfect combination of the fuel and the oxygen. This reality is also real for revivals, we often wonder how we can attract more people to God, how can we cause an impact in our region. What is the latest technique to bring people attention to your church, or what is the latest craze on TikTok videos. And none of that is wrong, we can and should use all the tools we have at our disposal, but we need to understand none of that will cause revival or cause permanent impact in people's lives. If you look at the history of revivals, you will see a recipe that repeats just as the same way as the recipe for blue fire does. All revivals were preceded by a perfect mixture of genuine desperate hunger for the presence of God and an unrelenting prayer and intercession. So, if we truly want to see revival on our region, we need to consider how hungry are we for God and how hard are we willing to go into prayer and intercession?

Today's Prayer: Father, thank you for your faithfulness guiding us and sustaining us through these 21 days of fasting. Thank you for the words you have spoken over our hearts and minds during these days. Please help us to put to action the things you have been speaking to our spirits during this past days. Allow us to be a genuine breath of life to our community.
